

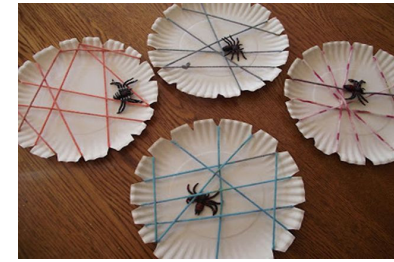


Maths

Make a spider using a circle of card and pegs as his legs. Count forwards and backwards while your child adds and removes the legs. Make it harder by asking subtraction questions such as, 'How many legs when I take 2 legs away?'

Spiders Webs

Paint some spiders webs using horizontal, vertical and diagonal strokes. Make it harder by creating a dot to dot for your child to follow.



Weaving

Cut slits in a paper plate or cardboard circle. Weave wool or string around to make a web. Make it harder by hole punching holes to thread through

Searching

Search for spiders outside or in the house. Make it harder by discussing where to look and why.

Questions

Pause the story on different pictures. Ask your child questions appropriate to them:
'Where is the spider?'
'What do you think happens next?'
'Who is making the food?'
'What happened to the spider's legs?'

Using a white wax crayon on white paper, draw a web. Paint over with water colour to reveal the web!
