



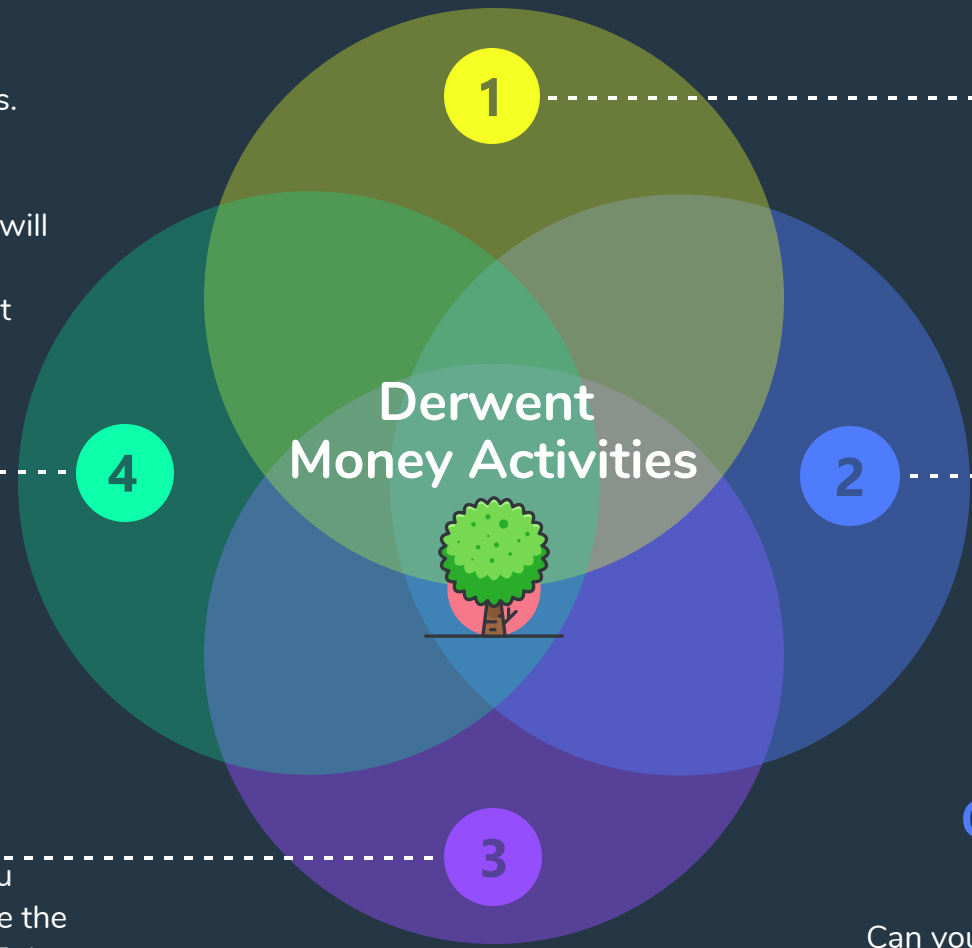
Counting

Practise counting coins in their different units: 1s, 2s, 5s, or 10s. Some children will be able to follow your finger as you count along the line to 5 or 10. Some will be able to start learning the number patterns of the different multiples.



Games

Role play a shopping activity! You could set up a food shop and give the foods different prices (1p, 2p or 5p). Make it harder by including addition (e.g. 12p). Some pupils have been working on the idea of simply exchanging a coin for a turn at a game.



Hide and Seek

Hide coins around the house or garden. How many can your child find? Can they match them to the same coin? Can they tell you the value, even when they can't see the number? Can they add two amounts together? (You could use 1p coins to support)



Grouping and sorting

Can your child sort a pile of coins into bronze and silver? Use money boxes (or 2 shoe box with a slit cut in) to turn it into a posting activity. Empty the boxes together to see if they all contain the same colour coin.
