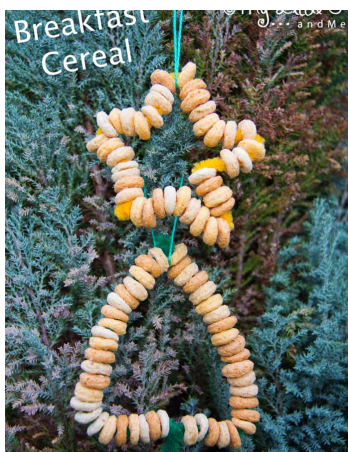
Activities for all the family using resources found in the home, garden or on your daily walk.

Minion Rock Pets

Start by painting half of the rocks yellow. Depending on the stone color, you may have to apply 2 or 3 coats of paint. On the bottom half, I used a pencil to draw a pocket and then the stripes, use alternate black and white paint for the stripes and leave the pocket white. Outline the pocket with grey and write the number with black. Draw the eyes and then paint them as detailed as you like. Don't forget about the mouth.

Breakfast Bird Feeders

This is a great activity for working fine motor skills. It makes use of any stale round cereal you might have in the house! Take a long length of string and tie a knot at the end that's big enough so the cereal can't drop through. Ask the students to put circle-shaped cereal, such as Cheerios, onto the string. Once the string is full, tie the ends together and secure it to a tree or branch.
