



Easter Activities for Buttermere

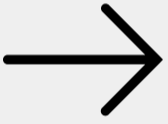
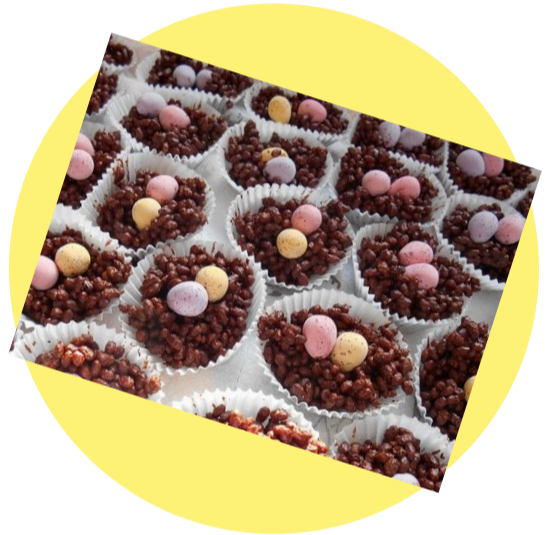
Easter Egg Mosaic

Can you tear pieces of paper and glue them on an oval piece of card or paper to create an Easter egg collage. You could recycle foil and cardboard from chocolate egg boxes or use coloured tissue paper or card.



Easter Egg Nests

Practise your grasping, pouring, stirring and mixing skills! Melt 50g chocolate and add 100g of bashed up shredded wheat or rice krispies. Add the mixture to some cupcake cases. Top with chocolate eggs and place in the fridge for some super quick tasty snacks which smell delicious too! Egg Box Printing

Make a flower by cutting out of one piece of an egg box. Dip it in paint and press on some paper, for a great printing effect. You can attach it to a regular paintbrush with a hair bobble/elastic band, stick it with glue to a lolly pop stick or even glue to a stick from the garden to make it easier to grasp.
