PSHCE is embedded throughout the curriculum in addition to being taught as a discrete subject. PSHCE not only encompasses structured units of study alongside SEAL themes (which is delivered through circle time), but also includes personal and life skills which are promoted on a daily basis both within the school curriculum and beyond. Additional opportunities for learning include school activities, concerts, residential holidays, home management, travel and vocational models
